

I AM WITH YOU

These past few months have been difficult with my dad being in the hospital and his eventual passing. We were fortunate as a family to be allowed to all come together in Dad's ICU room when he passed. It was crowded and there were lots of tears but there was some laughing too as we shared memories. We realized how lucky we were to all be able to be together at that moment. It was a good thing that they had him in a bigger ICU room than he had been in before because there were almost 30 of us in his room at the end. We understand how fortunate we were to be together at this time. As Dad was passing, our daughter Victoria, said 'bring the rain Grandpa'. Even though it was the beginning of June, we hadn't had rain in quite a while and a burning ban was in place. The day of the funeral, it rained a little bit in the morning. Then when we went to the cemetery, we could hear the thunder and see the sky getting darker and before we left, it started to rain. We all said 'thanks Dad'.

These reminders help us to remember that our loved one is always with us and it helps us to keep going. There have been many instances like this since he passed. Sometimes it feels like hardly a day goes by when there isn't a reminder or a way of him letting us know that he is always with us. Maybe it's because it's so new in our lives yet. I wonder if we will still see all of the little signs as reminders that he is still with us in 5 years, 10 years.... I know everyone has been touched by their own loss and has had their own personal experiences.

Jesus said, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:20. Do we take the time to see the signs that Jesus is still with us? We are all so busy and sometimes it feels like there are so many negative things happening that it's sometimes easy to forget that Jesus is always with us. Do we still notice the signs that remind us of his presence or are we too wrapped up in our own lives that we miss them? Not all of his reminders are going to be as big as a sunrise, a sunset or a rainbow. Most times his reminders will be more personal to each person. We just need to take more time to appreciate the reminders that he gives us and to remember that he is always with us in the good times and the bad times. He is with us when we celebrate and when we need comforting. He is always encouraging us to keep going even when we don't think we can.

Making A Difference

Vesta Stoudt worked in a factory in Illinois during World War II. She inspected ammunition boxes and noticed a major flaw. The boxes at the time were sealed with paper and a pull tab, but the paper tab would get soaked and allow water into the container. This ruined the ammo, so the soldiers would dip the boxes in wax to keep everything dry. Problem was, the wax made it much harder to access the ammo, which is more than an inconvenience when fumbling with an ammo box during intense firefights could cost someone their life.

Vesta had two sons in the military, and she knew plenty of other families with enlisted soldiers too. She wanted them all to get what they needed for the fights they were in. She didn't just stay concerned, she got busy. She realized she had permission to create and innovate, so she dove into the immense task of trying to fix the problem she saw. She drew diagrams and made samples to fix the ammo boxes. When her work was complete, she prepared a presentation for her supervisors to get their support. She was convinced her invention of a sticky tape could save many lives. Unfortunately, her boss thought it was a lousy idea. Why create waterproof fabric tape? Lesson one here: Don't let your great idea wither as you wait for approval.

Vesta didn't take no for an answer when her idea wasn't well received, and she wasn't going to wait for approval from someone who didn't see her vision. She knew why she was doing what she was doing. She wanted her sons to have what they needed and refused to get knocked off course by the person who had authority over her job but not her life. She was filled with intention, and she was determined.

Vesta decided to go to the TOP. She went to the president of the United States. She sent a letter to President Roosevelt that included her idea and a sample. Then she asked for approval to manufacture what she had dreamed up so people could fight the fights they were in.

Her idea was approved for immediate production. VESTA STOUDT'S IDEA AND WORK LED TO THE INVENTION OF DUCT TAPE!!!

One woman refused to believe she needed permission to follow her gut and her imagination. She made some bold moves to see it through. It didn't matter to her that others couldn't understand, didn't approve, or didn't see the need for her idea. She wasn't looking for approval; she was focused on the possibilities.

Today the military still uses duct tape for all kinds of applications. One of its unofficial names, "100 mph tape" because it has been used to patch Jeep bumpers and even helicopter rotor blades. They also use it to patch worn-out boots and straps on packs. No space shot by NASA has ever left the earth without a roll or two of duct tape. You name it, and duct tape does it. As the saying goes, "If you can't fix it with duct tape, you need more duct tape."



Living your life with SOUL leads to joy and purpose. Faith might just be the duct tape you need to hold your dreams together. Everyone will face barriers, and the world is full of baubles and trinkets and naysayers and systemic pressures and injustices and misguided dreams that can take us off the path.

What possibilities do you envision for St John's or yourself? Living a life and being a church that has SOUL – serving others – uplifting lives.

Faith and determination are the "duct tape" to make our dreams a reality. We will have naysayers and critics that will try to take us off the path.

God's all-access path to life isn't a cheat code for an easy life, it's the key for a purposeful and joyful one making a difference!

Property Committee

Our property committee has been diligently working over the past few years to address areas of repair, updating, and enhancing our church grounds and facilities. We are thankful for these resolute members and for all of you who contribute to the building fund. Because of your generous gifts many long-overdue projects have been completed.

In the last few years, the rain gutters were flushed, the lawn tractor with snowblower attachment was updated, a chain link fence was installed, water softener and brick tuck pointing were accomplished. Recently the storage garage siding was replaced. Over the last several months you have read about an appeal to raise funds for updating our Parish Hall.

- -Initial review was for painting the walls and ceiling as well as ceiling panel repairs and updating the lighting. These updates were projected to cost twenty-two thousand dollars. The bulletin and announcements made us aware of the estimated cost.
- -As the committee took a closer look at the area and received input from the maintenance staff of the church a need to address the flooring was added. The current flooring is a labor-intensive maintenance chore, as well as broken tiles in several areas. Funding durable commercial quality flooring with consideration for the ongoing costs of cleaning and upkeep will require additional funding.
- -Come Alive members are also doing a review of the sound system.

Flooring and sound system update are obviously going to be a considerable additional cost.

As good stewards of the church's funding the committee is reviewing how best to utilize the generous gifts you give for our building.

Volunteers along with the staff of Dave and Brenda have done many of the "daily repairs." Updates of painting the classrooms, rest rooms, the library and club room kitchen.

It is visually evident we are blessed with a facility that is well maintained and cared for.

The council and the property committee continue to ask for your generous support for these projects.

Cream Puffs

1/2 c butter 1 c flour 1 c boiling water 4 eggs

Place butter and water in saucepan. As soon as it boils, add flour all at once until well mixed. Stir until it forms a ball and leave the sides of pan. Set off to cool. Add 1 egg, beat 5 minutes another egg, beat, and so on until all the eggs are used up in batter. Drop mixture on oiled, shallow pan. Bake in hot oven first, then reduce heat. When cool fill with whipped cream. Bake about 40 minutes.
