### Pause Ponder Pray September 2023

Recently a devotion I was reading talked about a woman who had learned she was cancer free. While she was thrilled, she also shared the sadness she felt because she could not share this news with her mom. Her mom had been unsuccessful in her battle against the disease and had died a few years earlier. It was her mom's diagnosis that had prompted the daughter to get checked out. The daughter said she celebrated the goodness of God even though her mom had died from the same disease.

And these are her words that hit home with me, "The goodness of God is not in the outcome;" the goodness of God is in the awareness of His presence and what that does in our lives."

How true those words have been for me in my life. All of us get "news" in our lives that is difficult to hear. It may be an illness diagnosis, a relationship severed, a sudden death, a job loss. No one is immune.

For me it was a diagnosis of myopic macular degeneration 10 years ago in both of my eyes. It altered my retirement plans from my job, my independence in traveling and simply driving in high traffic areas. In the last10 years since, I've had shots every few months to "slow down" the progression of the disease. I can no longer distinguish faces more than 20 feet away. My doctors tell me progression will continue – our plan is to slow it down, for how long no one knows.

HOWEVER, I've learned how to cope. I can still knit, read (large print), watch my sports and see the beauty of this world when looking out the window. Though my traveling has been curtailed I am thankful for all the trips I took over the years – and I have my memories. I have a wonderful group of friends and my dear family who take me as needed wherever I need to go. And my dear Heavenly Father has been there for me the whole time. Gently reminding me of my blessings when I am on my "pity pot". Leading me to doctors that so expertly use their gifts to take care of me. Guiding me to alternative options of how to cope with the changes.

I need only remember "You make known to me the path of life; You will fill me with joy in Your presence." Psalm 16:11.


### YEARS AGO...

### **Carmel Dumplings**

2 T. butter 2½ c. brown sugar 2½ c. boiling water Speck salt

Place in saucepan and boil about 5 min.

Dough:

1½ c. flour 1/8 tsp. salt 1½ tsp. baking powder 2 T. butter 1/3 c. sugar 1/3 tsp. vanilla

Sift dry ingredients. Cut in the butter and vanilla. Mix, drop by spoonful (tea-spoon) into boiling sauce. Cover tightly and boil gently over slow flame for 20 minutes. Do not remove the cover during the cooking period.

The tablets of stone symbolize God's giving of the Law to Israel through Moses on Mount Sinai (Horeb). They're often shown with Roman numerals I through III on the left tablet and IV through X on the right. This represents the Ten Commandments — with the first three focusing on God and the final seven focusing on other people. The image of the stone tablets also may represent the entire Old Testament.
